





On The Eastside builds connections and community

Anyone who has experienced the "Seattle Freeze" can attest, the Pacific Northwest can sometimes be a difficult place to make new friends.

When Liz Russell moved from Southern California to Woodinville and struggled with meeting new people in a new city, she knew that she wasn't alone in encountering that challenge. She noticed that while there were many opportunities in Seattle to connect with people, there weren't that many similar options available locally.

Russell decided to take matters into her own hands. What originally started as a way to push past the "Seattle Freeze" and meet new people, would eventually evolve into a full-time business connecting people in the community.


Russell started by working with co-founders Erica DeBord and Rebekah Young to form a Facebook group called The Eastside Women's Social Club. They began to host events where people could meet new friends, have fun and explore the Eastside. They began reaching out to local businesses to form partnerships, working with them to organize events such as fitness classes, game nights and holiday parties.

As the group continued to grow, Russell eventually decided to transition the work into a full-time business. Ever since, On The Eastside has thrived in her role as a community connector.

Russell sees the goals of On The Eastside as threefold: to help individuals make friends, network and build community.

Describing her work, Russell said, "It's hard to meet a new friend, or if you're a small business owner, connect with someone who can relate to you. I hope to fill that gap in as many ways as possible."

To work towards her organization's first objective, she organized a variety of "Speed Friending" events. At these events, participants can meet one another in a style similar to "speed dating" by engaging in a series of short



conversations with others in the group. A welcoming and relaxed atmosphere is encouraged, with fun icebreakers and conversation starters provided.

"It's less intimidating than going to a huge event full of people," Russell said. For those looking to connect with others who share similar interests or lifestyles, she organized speed-friending events specifically geared towards groups such as outdoor lovers, mothers, and introverts.

In addition to offering social events, Russell worked to increase opportunities for professional networking, working with Rachel Rowland to start a group called Eastside Entrepreneu-HERs. Focused on serving the needs of small business owners, the group meets twice a month and offers opportunities to network, support and learn from one another – while also having a good time.

As On The Eastside moves forward, Russell is excited to offer even more opportunities for professional connections. She plans to partner with local experts who can speak on local business topics, with the goal of helping small business owners thrive and connect with the business community.

In hosting her events, Russell partners with a variety of local businesses, which ranged from a jewelry making class with a local jewelry artist, to a chocolate bar making class at a chocolatier. Russell notes her appreciation for the businesses who partner with her, saying that their "symbiotic relationship" is beneficial to everyone involved. Russell also said that despite Woodinville's small size, it's



great diversity of businesses makes it easy for her to find a variety of interesting venues for events.

A particular passion of hers has been hosting Women's Day of Wellness events, which are a day for women in the community to come together to engage in self-care activities. Attendees can enjoy mini spa services while browsing products available from a variety of small local businesses, including artists, jewelry makers, estheticians and masseuses. lot of fun" for attendees, Russell notes that she is looking to expand them to other areas in the future. "I want to leave an impact on as many Eastside cities as possible," she said.

At one recent event, the group was having so much fun and wasn't ready to head home yet, so one woman suggested that everyone grab lunch together afterwards. For Russell, serving as a community connector has been an immensely rewarding experience. "It's comforting to know that I am doing a service for the community and that it is effective," she said. "I love hearing the appreciation and the experience that people have at my events. I have seen friendships form. That's one of the most joyous aspects of this – hearing the feedback of 'wow, this is awesome – I've gotten to meet new friends that I otherwise wouldn't have gotten to meet."

Kenzie & Dot Foundation works to support Woodinville community

For Christie and Bryan Streit, charitable giving and community focus have always been second nature.

As active members of the Woodinville community who cared deeply about local causes, the Streits had long wanted to expand the reach of their giving. As their aspirations grew, they decided to take things a step further and in February 2023, they started the Kenzie & Dot Foundation, a charitable organization which works to raise funds through events and partnerships to support youth and families in Woodinville and in the surrounding areas.

The funds raised by Kenzie & Dot go towards addressing inequality by providing resources and support to those who need it most. The ultimate goal of the foundation is to empower and uplift local youth and their families.

One beneficiary of Kenzie & Dot's fundraising has been the "Shop With A Cop" program, which partners with the Woodinville Police Department to match children with police officers for a shopping trip where children can buy holiday gifts at no cost to themselves.

To raise funds for this program, Kenzie & Dot held a golf tournament at Echo Falls Golf Club. In addition to golfing, it also featured a dunk tank with firefighters, and an "Outdrive the Chief" golfing contest with the Woodinville police chief. All in all, the event raised \$22k.

Another holiday-focused event was the Giving Tree, where community members bought and wrapped gifts for local families in need. People of all ages joined forces to participate, with Woodinville High School's girls' varsity basketball team pitching in to help with gift sorting and wrapping.

Food insecurity is another area of focus for Kenzie & Dot. At the "Pantry Stock Up" food drive, participants were invited to dinner at the Pizza Coop & Ale House, Christie and Bryan's Detroit-style pizzeria, bringing with them non-perishable items to donate to the Woodin Elementary Summer Food Bank. In the end, the event not only filled a trailer's worth of food for children in need, but also raised an additional \$500 cash donation for the food bank.







Events like these have not only benefited charitable organizations, but have also been enjoyable ways for neighbors, friends, and local residents to come together and connect. "It's been fun for us too – it's super rewarding," Christie said.

For Christie, it has been special to do this sort of work in a close-knit place like Woodinville. "It's a very family-oriented community. We really enjoy the way people interact and engage with each other, Christie said. "We feel very welcome and connected to families, schools, the arts and everything Woodinville has to offer. The way Woodinville supports one another [is something] we've really enjoyed being part of."

While starting a foundation from the ground up is never an easy task, the Kenzie & Dot leadership team has stepped up to the challenge.

"This is one of the kindest, most passionate and supportive groups that I have ever worked with," Christie said. "Seeing how a group can come together, generate ideas, listen to one another, appreciate backgrounds and experiences and start making a difference in the community in just a few short months is truly amazing."

Local engagement has been another key element of the success of Kenzie



& Dot's operations. When holding a planning meeting about the "Shop with a Cop" program, many local figures turned out to participate, including Woodinville Police Chief B.J. Myers, Woodinville Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Kimberly Ellertson, Greg Garat and Dustin Wuebel with Eastside Fire & Rescue, and Woodinville Mayor Mike Milliman. "We all worked together," Christie recalls, noting the shared enthusiasm of all participants for making the event a success.

Ultimately, the foundation is not just for the community, but also of the community. Christie encourages any interested individuals to volunteer their time and talents with the organization, adding that there will be an increased need for event volunteers around the holiday season.

Going forward, the foundation's clear mission will continue to be a guiding principle in its work.





Christie said, "We want all of our children to have the same upbringing and opportunities that were offered to us during our childhood and young adult lives. Kenzie & Dot wants to offer support where we can, whatever the need may be, and to continue to make Woodinville a truly incredible place for our youth to grow up and become positive contributing members to our greater society."


